Recovery

As we approach the point of almost one month since the collision involving our school bus, I would like to continue to acknowledge the wonderful community surrounding our school. We have had such heart-warming support from so many and this has allowed us to focus on supporting our children and their families. It has been lovely to see our kids returning to school and to observe the joy shown by our children, their families and our staff as the children return for visits or return to school. We are looking forward to having everyone back at school very soon!

Fundraising

There are two ways to donate to the Exford PS cause -

- Through TLC Kids and these funds will be used to support the families of children who were involved in the bus accident (e.g. household bills) - these funds include the fundraising linked to Neil Mitchell
 - I am working with our families to gain consent to provide their information to TLC Kids and then the affected families can apply 0 directly to TLC Kids for financial assistance.
 - (The consent to share information form was sent home to the families of the children who were on the Weir Views bus on Tuesday 16 0 May.)
- To Exford PS to provide additional therapies to support all our students as we recover (for example, for additional psychology and physiotherapy specialists and therapy dogs)
 - All these funds need to be deposited through Melton PS who are completing all the financial steps for donations to schools these 0 funds will then all be transferred to Exford PS for our use.
 - The Department has set up a financial team to oversee the deposits and their transfer to us and then will support us with expending 0 the funds.

Thanks to everyone who has donated money into our Exford fundraising jar - \$569.80 has been raised. Thank you again to Ella in Year 2 who came up with the idea to place a donation jar in our office.

Traffic Accident Commission (TAC)

Please note that TAC will cover all the medical costs for the affected children - we urge all families to make a claim (even if your child was only mildly injured or had no physical injury). The children may require support for both physical and psychological injuries in the time to come and making a claim now is important. Please contact TAC on 1300 654 329 to speak to a claims advisor. Families of the affected children should also make a TAC claim.

Special visitors

We were comforted by the combined visit of the Premier Dan Andrews, the Minister for Education Natalie Hutchins and our local Member of Parliament Steve McGhie, who all visited us on the afternoon of



Friday 26 May. We spoke about our children and their recovery, the wonderful efforts of our community. We also spoke at length about the political action needed to bring about changes to the road and speed conditions in the Melton district and how we needed their support to expedite change. We have had similar conversations with the team from Melton Council, about our local school area specifically and the wider district.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships Program

All Victorian schools will undertake the Respectful Relationships program - Exford PS will join the latest intake of schools.

Respectful Relationships whole school approach (education.vic.gov.au)

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships is a suite of teaching and learning materials for Foundation to Year 12.

The resources have been developed by experts from Deakin University and the University of Melbourne. These age -appropriate resources support curriculum delivery and include lesson plans and activities that help students learn and practise social skills and apply them in a positive way to learning, life and relationships.

The materials cover eight social and emotional learning topics to support the delivery of respectful relationships content through the Victorian curriculum.

The resources support a whole of school approach to creating equal and respectful attitudes, behaviours, structures and practices across the school culture and ethos.

Taking a whole-school approach is about embedding a culture of respect and equality across an entire school community, from our classrooms to staffrooms, sporting fields, fetes and social events. This approach leads to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, mental health, classroom behaviour, and relationships between teachers.

The resource kit provides tools, advice and strategies to guide Respectful Relationships leading and partner schools through a framework implementing the six core elements of the Respectful Relationships whole-school approach:

Gallery Building Renovation



Uniform / Lost Property – a reminder to ensure all uniform items are clearly marked with your child's name, this enables us to return items to your child without delay.

Asthma & Anaphylaxis Plans – A reminder to return your child's Asthma and / or Anaphylaxis plans back to the Office. If you have misplaced this document, please call Mrs Kelly in the Office.

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time for and to be at school EVERY day.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell – <u>EVERY</u> day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school – academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the FlexiSchools app or email the school directly on <u>exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> – all student absences must be explained in writing.

WRITING IN PREP AKAMATIS










In Prep Akamatis, we have been learning about Procedural writing. Procedural writing teaches us how to do and make something.

Year 1-2 AMBROSE



Next week we are going to read our stories to students in other classes. We will also meet a visiting author, Heath McKenzie, and learn about the books he has written and illustrated.




































Poetry Writing Year 3/4 Monagle

Enrolment & Transition Support

Entering secondary school is an exciting stage of life but it can also be a very anxious time for students and families as they make their decision about the type of education they want and where they want to attend. At Marian College our philosophy has always been to create a welcoming environment for all and to build positive relationships with students and families so that they feel a sense of belonging within the school as quickly as possible. We feel that this is imperative to the learning, wellbeing and academic success of all our students. It is especially important at Year 7 and is why we have constructed a transition and development program to minimise levels of apprehension and allow our new students to be prepared for their secondary school journey.

Our transition process encourages students and families to come into the school at different times and for various reasons to become familiar with the facilities and make connections with some of the staff before they enter Year 7. Our Year 7 students attend local primary schools to speak about their own transition process and our Learning Diversity department makes contact with primary teachers to discuss students attending Marian and how we can best support them in their transition to Marian.

We have a strong pastoral care program where the wellbeing of each member of our community is paramount. Year 7 Homeroom teachers support the transition of each student monitoring how they are settling into the school, encouraging friendships and supporting them with their timetabled classes, new technologies and organisation. This support continues through a number of programs and activities designed to allow students to grow into the life of the College. Students are further supported by a Year Level Leader and Learning Leader who work together with the Year 7 team to cater to the needs of each individual student, implementing different strategies to assist them in their academic and social development throughout the year.

Families are also invited to take part in the Marian Community and engage as active partners in their daughters' learning by attending Information Evenings, Parent/Student/Teacher Conferences, STEAM and Music Showcases, Art Exhibitions, Sporting Carnivals and Special Morning Teas.

At Marian College we believe in communication and have a team of leaders, teachers and support staff that are available to answer any questions or concerns you may have. Each year we are excited about welcoming new students into our school and look forward to communicating with you about your daughter's education.

Activities, events and special programs at Marian College are outlined in our Transition calendar. Each year we continually add to this calendar based on student and parent feedback in order to make the transition from primary to secondary school smooth, inclusive and lasting.
