

2023 Staffing News

At this time of the year, staff apply for new roles in their own schools and in other schools.

 who have been selected to the role of Professional Team Leaders for 2023,
 and they will each lead one of our teaching teams, working with either Ms
 Littlewood or Mr Jenner, our Learning Specialist Teachers and with Mr Wilson
 and me.

We are finalising our class lists and then we will begin to attach our teaching and ES staff to classes. The children will find out who their 2023 staff will be on our 'Step Up Day' on Tuesday 13 December. Whilst there is always uncertainty about any change, especially after the past two years, if your child is feeling anxious about next year, it is good to remind the children that change and getting used to new people is part of life.

Whilst parents are always welcome to share their thoughts with me about which teacher they would like their child to be with, we place our teaching and ES staff strategically to suit the whole school program. It is not always possible to grant individual requests. We are very lucky at Exford to have such positive staff who are focused on supporting the kids to the best of their ability – we only select the staff with that potential!

Stage Two begins!

We have had our first meeting with our new building company – I am waiting for the formal announcement from the Minister's Office before I can share the news of the company's name. They are working on a site establishment and traffic management plan, as they work towards commencing on our two storey Senior Learning Building, which will have our new Art room and Music room and eleven classrooms. The Senior Learning Building will be located in the bottom right corner of our site – near the current student entry to the school (where all the Mod 5 portables used to be before their removal in July / August of this year). The bottom end of the car park will become the builder's site compound. There will be a student and family entry point installed closer to the front of the car park and we will reconsider and communicate how we manage morning drop-offs and afternoon pick-ups when we have more information for you. The tentative start date is Tuesday 15 November to begin establishing the site compound.

Xuno

We have signed up for Xuno to combine the apps which we use. We will provide 'how to' guides for our families once we have done our training and we will roll out our use of Xuno for the 2023 school year. We will then no longer use FlexiSchools, School Interviews website for our community and will also lose a number of apps / programs for our staff.

Attendance - Every moment of every day counts

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom
 environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time

for school every day – especially as we try to support children even more after the Remote Learning challenges of 2020 and 2021.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell - EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school - academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the FlexiSchools app or email the school directly on exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au – all student absences must be explained in writing.




Poetry Writing in

written.
























































Recipe
