Welcome to Term 4!

Here we are in the final term of the school year. In Term 4, it always feels as if we have a foot in this school year still, whilst we also plan to step into the new school year.

Having two days of rain at the start of the school was a bit of a shock to the system after the gorgeous weather we had been having in Melbourne, but our kids enjoyed some indoor games in their recess and lunch break times.

If you could check with your child that they have their hat, and if not, please order a new hat for them from our school office. Traffic around our school

I need to remind all our families that the safety of our children in our school is everyone's responsibility. As we all know, our car park is strictly **ONE WAY** – with the entrance to the car park being near the new Office building. We have observed drivers coming into the car park and then driving straight down into the side car park. Drivers **MUST NOT** enter the car park through the exit lane.

There is a clear speed zone marked in our car park and we ask everyone to drive slowly through our car park, to keep everyone's children safe.

We are also observing drivers park in the Visitor car parks near the Office and then walk their children in at drop off time. We ask that you park elsewhere or use our 'Kiss and Drop' space in the Bus zone, which is supervised by a member of our Leadership team.

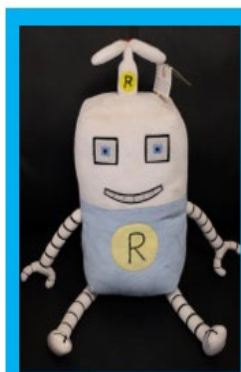

2024 is on its way

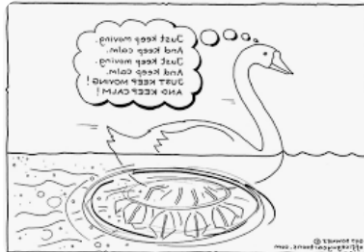

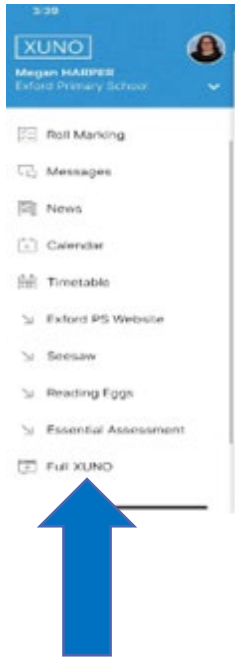

XUNO PDF documents and notifications



If you are using the XUNO app, you will need to access the 'Full XUNO' site to view any PDF documents, including Newsletters, Individual Learning plans etc.

To do this, click on your dashboard. Towards the bottom of the list, you will see 'Full XUNO'. Select that option, which will open XUNO in a browser. Then from here you can make your way to the item you would like to view. Newsletters are under our 'News' section.


Notifications are now working. For any messages sent, you will receive a push notification (we highly recommend having this turned on). For news items and other actions in XUNO there will be a red notification mark on the XUNO app itself, no push notification is sent for these items.

Attendance – Every moment of every day counts

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons – so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time for and to be at school EVERY day.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell – EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school – academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the XUNO or email the school directly on exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au – all student absences must be explained in writing.



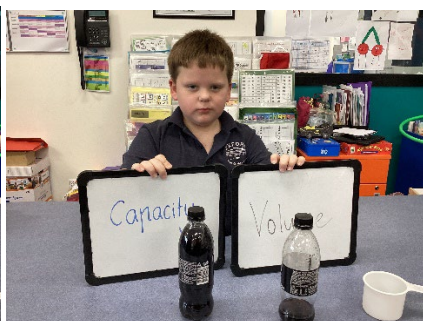

Have been learning about Capacity and Volume

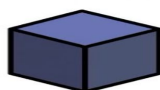

$$\text{Volume} = l \times w \times h$$

Capacity



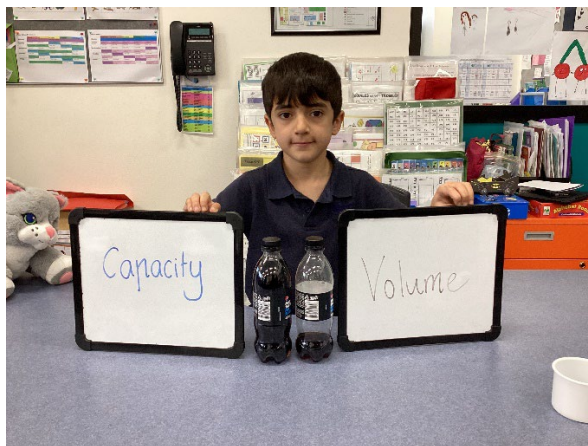
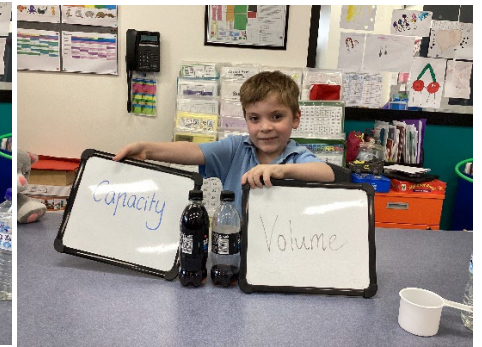
The amount that something can hold.



What is Capacity?

Capacity is a measure of how much a container can hold. We might measure the capacity of a bottle, cup or carton - anything which can hold something else!

This carton holds 1 litre of milk. It has a **capacity** of 1 litre.

We can use different equipment to measure capacity.

Estimating Capacity

When you are estimating capacity it is useful to think of containers you are familiar with and how much they contain.



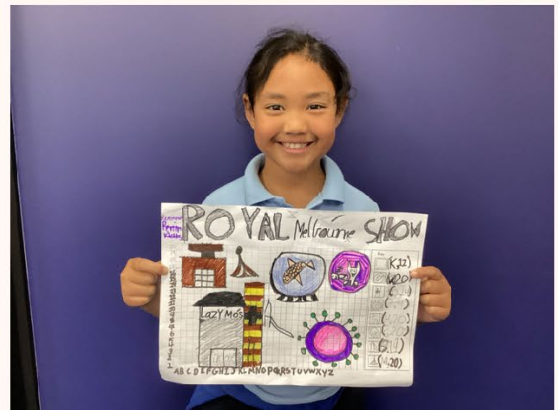

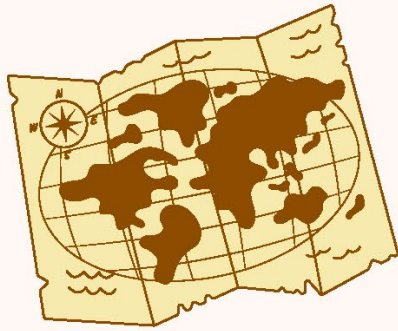
Location & Maps

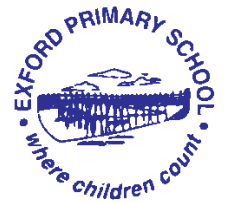
