Ms Campo's News....

2022 Christmas and Year 6 Graduation Concert

After not being able to have our lovely Christmas Concert tradition over the past two COVID years...it's BACK!! Our Concert will be held on Friday 16 December from 9:30 am and all our families are very welcome to join us. Families are asked to bring their own seating. We will use our existing stage and the area in front of the stage will be reserved for student seating. Behind the row of seats at the back of the Assembly area, we will set up a few rows of chairs for families to sit on when it is their child's class on the stage – and then they would return to their own seating. We didn't hire a stage as we were not sure where our Construction team would be at and whether the oval would be available. I have notified MelbCon that we will need to use the school half of the car park throughout the day and for them to avoid any construction traffic on that day. Please note that parking is always at a premium (even though we have more parking than most schools) and for families to come in a single vehicle if possible.

2023 Staffing

Next year's teachers

(Repeated from last newsletter) We have been supporting the children throughout this year to rediscover their resilience and ability to cope with change. As we know, dealing with change and the mild to severe anxiety this can make people experience, is part of life and part of being human. As a community, our families and our school staff, we shield the children from situations as much as we can - but experiencing and coping with change is something we support them with.

For 2022, we tried to keep things fairly consistent and many children had their teacher and the same class mates for the second year, in response to the impact of Remote Learning on their social and emotional resilience. As part of our strategy to keep supporting our children's wellbeing and their ability to cope with change, all children will have a different teacher from the one they have had this year and we will continue working with the children to feel confident about looking forward to meeting their new teachers and class mates.

We will share the information about the teacher and class matches and ES allocation on our 'Step Up' Day on Tuesday 13 December and will advise parents through Seesaw. Please note that changes to classes and teachers are extremely difficult to make at this point in our planning and organisation.

NEWS - Mr Gundry informed me yesterday that he and his family are relocating to Queensland and he will be teaching in a school there from 2023. I have advertised for a teacher replacement: the vacancy closes on Tuesday 13 December and then we will move into Selection Panel mode – so the 'Step Up Day' activity for one class won't happen on Tuesday 13 December, but will happen later in the week, once we have selected a replacement teacher.

Lost Property

As the weather warms up and the children remove their jumpers in the playground. Please ensure all items are clearly labelled with your child's name. Lost property is emptied each night and items with names are returned to the children the next day.

We are unfortunately, still getting unnamed items handed in to lost property. The lack of a clearly written name delays or prevents the return of items to children.

Attendance - Every moment of every day counts

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom
 environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time

for school every day – especially as we try to support children even more after the Remote Learning challenges of 2020 and 2021.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell - EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school - academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the FlexiSchools app or email the school directly on exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au – all student absences must be explained in writing.







Christmas Concert Information

Friday 16 December - Concert begins at 9:30 am.

Our end of year Christmas and Year 6 Graduation Concert is a lovely Exford tradition that we've been missing through these past COVID-affected years and we hope all our families are able to come and join us - the children need to be in their classrooms by 8:50 am and the Concert starts at 9:30 am. Families are welcome to have picnic lunches in our school grounds afterwards.

Concert arrangements

Parking - please be aware that there is never enough parking!

BYO Seating - Seating for our families is BYO camp chairs.

Reserved Seating - there is some reserved seating for our families who are involved in the Fundraising group who work at the FR efforts until the start of the Concert.

There is also a student seating area - students need to <u>remain</u> with their classes throughout the Concert. Extended family members and friends are also welcome.

Entry

There are no ticket / entry costs, however, our Concert event is also our last major fundraising event for the year and every cent of our Fundraising dollars provide 'Reading Eggs' program for our Year Prep-4 students and iPad technology for every student at our school. In the past, we always aim to raise funds for our children through the sale of the Raffle tickets (pre-sales included).

<u>STRICTLY NO ALCOHOL OR SMOKING</u> - as a school event, our Concert evening has a strictly NO ALCOHOL policy and no smoking is permitted within the school grounds or within 400 metres of a school entry.

Student Arrival time - The children need to be at school at 8:50 am and go to their classrooms, ready for the final costume adjustments. They will come out to the stage area ready for a 9:30 am (ish!) start.

<u>Raffle Tickets</u> - We ask our families to support the school by buying and selling our Raffle tickets. There are many great prizes available to be won. 




In Writing, we are writing Autobiographies on ourselves! We have ensured to start each paragraph with an attention grabbing story that engages our reader.

It has been lovely reflecting on our personal lives and achievements!


