Ms Campo's news....

The end of the year is nearly here!

There are only three Mondays left of the 2023 school year and three jam-packed weeks to go. These are some of our activities over the next weeks:

- Our Year 6 students will have their special excursion to the Adventure Park on Monday 4 December
- We are packing up for our move into the new Senior Learning Building (Removalists begin on Thursday 14 December)
- Thursday 14 December Variety Christmas Party for those who have registered (this will be marked as 'other educational activity' in terms of attendance)
- Classes are rehearsing their performances for our lovely end of year Christmas Concert, which will be held on Tuesday 19 December at the Bacchus Marsh Community Hall

- Our Year 6 Graduation event will be held on Tuesday 19 December at the Bacchus Marsh Community Hall (in the evening)

- We will finalise the 2023 Semester Two reports and these will be sent home on Thursday 14 December
- Finalising our teacher and class matches ready for Step Up Day
- Our 2024 Prep and new Year 1-6 children Transition program is almost finished
 - Monday 11 December 2024 Exford Step Up Day will be on including 2024 new Year 1-6 kids – letters will be posted to Seesaw after the Step Up Day activity
 - Tuesday 12 December 2024 Preps final Transition visit with next year's teacher – letters will be posted to Seesaw next week
 - Tuesday 12 December 2024 Year 7 students have their Transition Day at their secondary college

Time in Lieu (TIL) repayments

Our staff are taking their Time in Lieu in response to their attendance at Camps and other after school activities (e.g. Year 1 'Dinner and a Show' and Year 6 Graduation.) Whilst the granting of TIL in the 2022 Victorian Government Schools Agreement was certainly a win for school staff who have long attended after hours activities in their own time, it is proving very challenging to implement as there are no replacement staff nor funds to pay for overtime payments. This means that classes need to be split and /or teaching and leadership staff are being pulled out of their other roles to cover teacher absences (normal and TIL related absences). ES office and integration aide staff are simply not replaced.

We will be reflecting on how we can reduce the range of activities which incur TIL – many events will be rescheduled to occur only in the school day from 2024, to minimise the impact of TIL payments on our classroom programs.



Attendance – Every moment of every day counts

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time for and to be at school EVERY day.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell – EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school – academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.


















We explored using similies in poems, as well as creating acrostic poems using our name.







BYO Seating - There is some seating at the Hall, however some of the 300 seats will be reserved so we recommend you bring some camp chairs.

There is also a student seating area - students need to <u>remain</u> with their classes throughout the Concert. Extended family members and friends are also welcome.

Entry

There are no ticket / entry costs, however, our Concert event is also our last major fundraising event for the year and every cent of our Fundraising dollars provide 'Reading Eggs' program for our Year Prep-4 students and iPad technology for every student at our school. In the past, we always aim to raise funds for our children through the sale of the Raffle tickets (pre-sales included).

STRICTLY NO ALCOHOL OR SMOKING - as a school event, our Concert evening has a strictly NO ALCOHOL policy and no smoking is permitted within 400 metres of the Community Hall.

Student Arrival time - The children need to be at school at 8:50 am and go to their classrooms, ready for the final costume adjustments and transport to the Bacchus Marsh Community Hall. We will be sending out a Xugo task for you to complete - whether your child / children will go home with you after the Concert or will return to school with the school group via buses.

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
