The new Victorian Government Schools Agreement (not yet finalised)

You may have read about the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement in the media and what it means for our teachers and Education Support staff.

I'm grateful to be the Principal of a school where the staff care so deeply about their community, are knowledgeable and skilful in their practice, and have a mindset focused on continuous improvement. When visiting classrooms throughout the school, I see firsthand the respectful and engaging interactions between teachers, students, and parents. We have all focused on supporting our students to re-establish friendships and strong work habits after the disruptions of the past two years. Whilst COVID is very much a daily concern, it is no longer a distraction from us undertaking our core business and focusing on our school's strong focus on supporting our students academically.

We have already recommenced a number of our extracurricular activities as we endeavour to increase the level of student engagement across the school. We have planned excursions, incursions and school camps for our students. However, teachers do not get paid any extra for the enormous responsibility of school camps, and on behalf of all our students who will enjoy time away this year – thank you.

Having been asked about the possible impact of the 'in-principal' VGSA (industrial agreement) after reading the recent article, 'Warning - Teachers' Win On Time In Lieu Will Endanger School Camps' (The Age), <u>https://www.theage.com.au/politics/victoria/warning-teachers-win-on-time-in-lieu-will-endanger-school-camps-20220224-p59z7v.html</u>

... I am also concerned about the potential impact of elements of the 'Agreement'. Teachers are an incredibly committed and professional team who go way beyond the 'standard requirements' and do deserve to be adequately compensated. With the way 'Time In Lieu' is being proposed, programs that are not a part of the standard Victorian Curriculum (namely activities which occur outside the normal school day – e.g. Camps, Activity evenings, School Concerts, ANZAC Day attendance etc) are all at risk. Events that are not extra-curricular (parent-teacher meetings, for example), will likely in future need to be brought inside the standard work hours.

At this stage, DET have confirmed to that there is no additional funding for schools to provide for Time in Lieu for teachers. To give you a rough idea – a school camp which is planned for 4 days with 5 Education Support staff and 6 teachers attending - the ES receive their TIL by having additional leave days within the calendar year where they are <u>not</u> replaced in the classroom. The teachers, however, will need to be replaced by a Casual Replacement Teacher for the hours they attend Camp outside of their normal employment hours – this will be costly and not to mention that there are no CRTs available currently.

The new Agreement is still in the ratification stages and when we have more information for you, we will provide it for you.



If your child is unable to attend school, a FlexiSchools absence must be submitted. When submitted via FlexiSchools, both the Classroom and Office are notified of this absence.

CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)

The CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use only towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$125 for primary school students.

If you applied for the CSEF at Exford Primary School in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Your child's school will apply for the CSEF on your behalf. You will only need to apply in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in a previous year
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2021

If a form was not lodged in 2021, parents or legal guardians are required to complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with their child's school for processing.

Application forms should be completed and lodged with schools as soon as possible in Term One, as payments are made from March onwards. However, schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term Two each year. Application forms can be collected from the office or obtained directly from the website.

Uniform / Lost Property – a reminder to ensure all uniform items are clearly marked with your child's name, this enables us to return items to your child without delay.

Asthma & Anaphylaxis Plans – A reminder to return your child's Asthma and / or Anaphylaxis plans back to the Office. If you have misplaced this document, please call Mrs Kelly in the Office.

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- · The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time

for school every day – especially as we try to support children even more after the Remote Learning challenges of 2020 and 2021.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell - EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school - academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the FlexiSchools app or email the school directly on <u>exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> - all student absences must be explained in writing.


