## Ms Campo's news....

### Carpark this morning

Our car park at morning drop-off time this morning was a strange sight to behold. Due to the accident at the intersection of Greigs and Exford Road going up into Melton South, traffic was stopped and diverted. Thanks to our families who provided us with updates around the traffic situation. In situations such as this (and may they be few and far between), we will always provide ongoing updates about the situation.



### School Photos Day

Our School Photo Day is on Friday 31 March, which is only a fortnight away. Children must be in full school uniform – with shoulder length hair tied back and no jewellery can be worn as per our Uniform Policy. The children need to wear either the royal blue windcheater (or hooded windcheater) or our navy-blue bomber jacket over the school dress or over the polo shirt (either navy or sky-blue) worn with the skirts or shorts. We will begin with our Prep classes at the start of the day and work our way up to our Year 5-6 classes progressively. Children will also have their portrait photo taken (regardless of photo packs being ordered) as we use these photos in Seesaw and our Cases 21 Administration program. Please make sure that your child's photo order pack is returned by Friday 31 March at the latest. The Year 6 Graduation photo will be taken, as will School and Vice School Captain photos and our School Ambassador photos.

### School Ambassadors

Our School Ambassadors will be presented at our School Assembly tomorrow afternoon. The Year 5-6 students have assumed their roles over the past fortnight; we weren't able to present them to our community last Friday due to the MPSSA Lightning Premiership.

### Car park – 'Stop and Drop' Zone

Whilst we have more car parking spaces than most schools, our car park is still a very busy place at pick up and drop off times. We ask all families to drive courteously and treat each other with respect and patience. As communicated last week, we have established a morning **'Stop and Drop' zone**. This is in the Bus Zone, after the buses have both arrived. If you plan to walk your child into class, please park safely before allowing children to exit the car. We ask some families to think about coming at 3:35 pm, to stagger the traffic and the car park demand. We will always supervise the children.

**Please note that all traffic and road rules apply in car parks as well, even school car parks. Please drive and park carefully and courteously.**

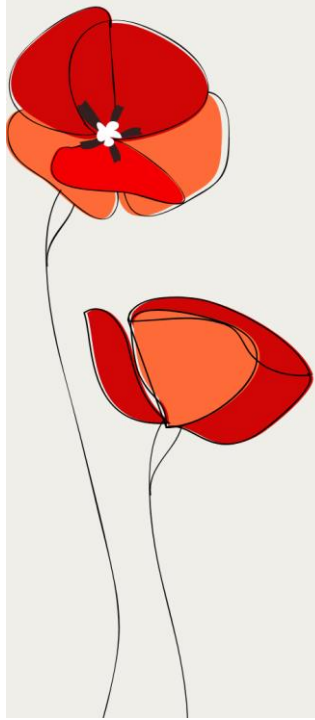

### ANZAC DAY LEST WE FORGET

## CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)

The CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use only towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students.
- 

If you applied for the CSEF at Exford Primary School in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

Your child's school will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

**You will only need to apply in 2023 if any of the following changes have occurred:**

- **New student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools in 2023 or you did not apply at the same school in a previous year
- **Changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2023

If a form was not lodged in 2022, parents or legal guardians are required to complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with their child's school for processing.

Application forms should be completed and lodged with schools as soon as possible in Term One, as payments are made from March onwards. However, schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term Two each year.

## Premiers Reading Challenge



### Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Exford Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8 September 2023.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

## Attendance – Every moment of every day counts

### Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons – so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

**Please help your child to arrive on time for and to be at school EVERY day.**

**Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell – EVERY day at school counts.**

### **If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.**

This will support your child to achieve their best at school – academically and personally.

### **If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.**

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

**CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.**

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

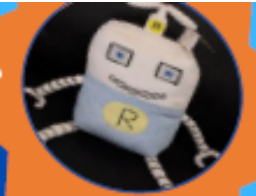

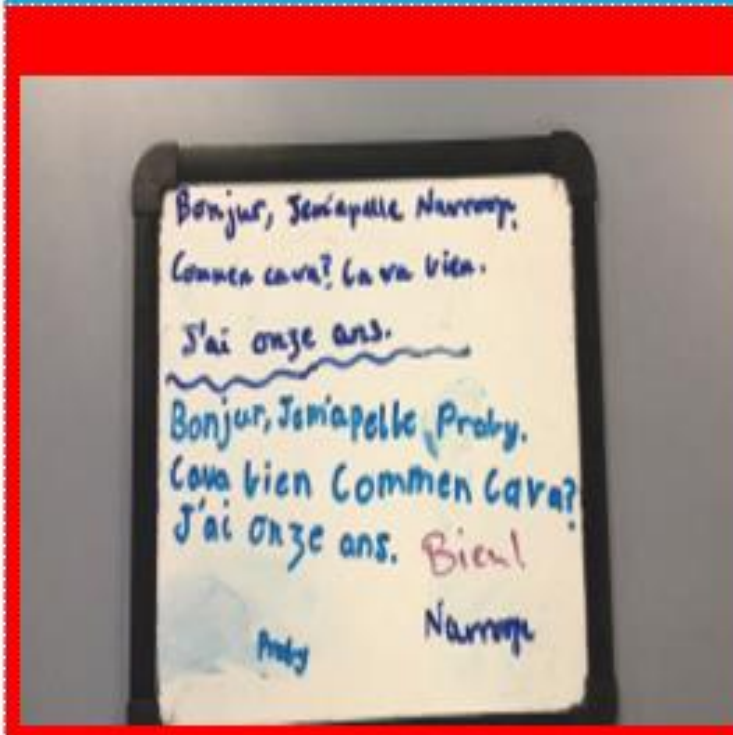

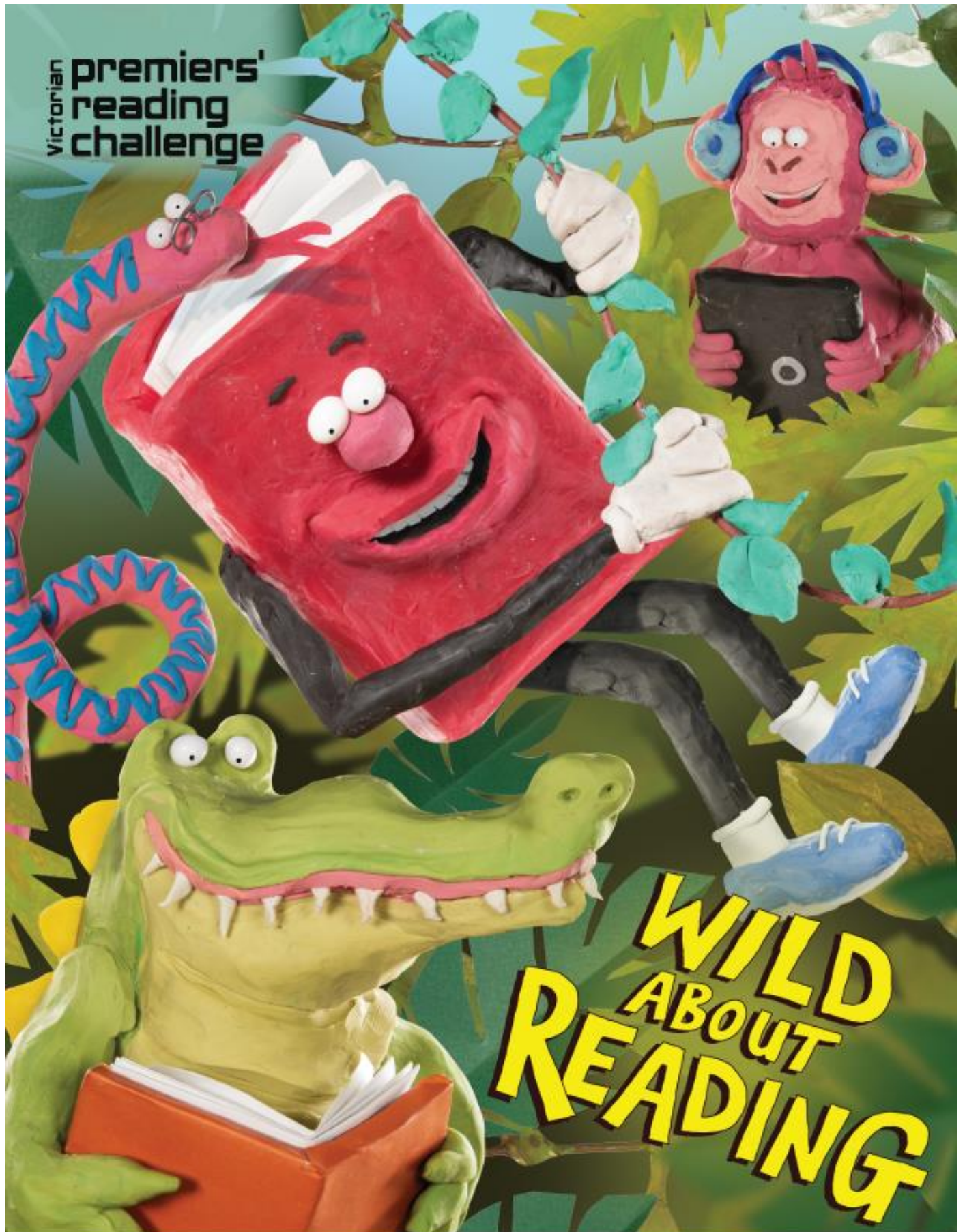
