# Ms Campo's News....

# Welcome back

Well, here we are, back at school ready for all that Term 2 brings us. It was great to have our children return on Wednesday and to hear about their holiday adventures. When I visited our classrooms in the mornings, it has been great to see our kids and staff working hard. Apparently, it was raining Gotchas in Year 1-2 Roe's room, they tell me! Tomorrow, it may be raining for real (according to the forecast) so we may have our first wet day timetable for the term. If it is too wet for our first Friday afternoon Assembly, we will let you know by FlexiSchools by 2:30 pm tomorrow.

Mr Wilson will be on leave for the first four weeks of Term 2, and we will track his travels as he visits the north of Australia. Ms Littlewood is Acting Assistant Principal for this period of time. The Term 2 Teams Newsletter will be sent along with this newsletter, outlining all the programs for this term's learning programs across the school, including our specialist programs.

## **Greater Western Water works**

We have begun working with GWW regarding our connection to mains water and mains sewerage as part of our Stage 1 Construction. GWW will construct a pump station which will be sited in what is currently the builders' parking compound. They will also install the water lines which will connect us with mains water. The water and sewerage services hope to be completed by the end of June 2022 and there will be works during the Term 2 school holidays.

## Admin and Junior Learning Building

I was able to join the Site Meeting today and tour the new Admin and JLB – the plaster is now installed in the Admin building and it is really taking shape. We are beginning to look at our furniture requirements and have them ordered to be delivered in time for the big move – hopefully early in Term 3. These classes will move into the JLB – our two Prep classes, our four Year 1-2 classes and Year 3-4 Fyfe and Tekin. Art will move into the old Staffroom. Then the three Mod 5 buildings at the back of the school will be removed and the builders will start on the two storey Senior Learning Building, which will also include the Art and the Music room. We have included a page of construction photos from the Minister's visit on Wednesday 6 April and I will organise the photos I took on today's Site Tour into a page for the next newsletter. It's looking amazing!



### **CSEF** (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)

The CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use only towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students.

If you applied for the CSEF at Exford Primary School in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Your child's school will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to apply in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in a previous year
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2021

If a form was not lodged in 2021, parents or legal guardians are required to complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with their child's school for processing.

Application forms should be completed and lodged with schools as soon as possible in Term One, as payments are made from March onwards. However, schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term Two each year. Application forms can be collected from the office or obtained directly from the website.

#### Attendance – Every moment of every day counts

#### Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

#### Please help your child to arrive on time

for school every day – especially as we try to support children even more after the Remote Learning challenges of 2020 and 2021.

Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell - EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year.

This will support your child to achieve their best at school - academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year.

The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.

Please make sure that you use the FlexiSchools app or email the school directly on <u>exford.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> – all student absences must be explained in writing.







# Lunch time Clubs at Exford PS

These activities happen on a daily basis and are each supervised by one of our teachers.




